

SUMMARY OF VIRTUAL NATIONAL COMMANDANT'S CORNER ZOOM MEETING

PURPOSE: Connecting with the community to build a strong next generation.

ACCEPTANCE: To be accepted as a Young Marine (YM) the applicant must demonstrate an array of quality characteristics and habits. The lessons learned as YM and the character that it builds, will have far-reaching effects for future generations.

The opportunity to become a YM is a privilege, not a right. There is strict criteria essential for acceptance. Sadly, the pool of eligible candidates has decreased tremendously from previous generations. It is estimated that eligibility is down 29% from the 2013 calculations. Many of our youth are not eligible due to any indiscretions or a demonstration of disrespect or irresponsibility. The youth must be upstanding citizens, students and human beings.

OPPORTUNITY: Once accepted, the YM can rise through the ranks as in the Marines. They can even attain status of officer. Although the officer criteria is rigid and difficult, the opportunity does exist. The program's leaders believe that there is a real need for opportunities such as this in every community. Some schools agree and have implemented the YM program as either an elective or mandatory. Additionally, some members of Congress have endorsed the program and desire for it to be expanded.

HELP: Adult volunteers are needed. The volunteers to not need to be a Marine. Military/former military, and quality citizens are welcome to be leaders.

U.S.S. THE SULLIVANS

WORLD WAR II ERA DESTROYER TAKING ON WATER

The historic Destroyer, U.S.S. The Sullivans was renamed such in honor of the five Sullivan brothers who served on a light cruiser and perished in 1942 in



Buffalo hosted the 95th National MCL Convention. Some of the activities were held close to the Erie County Naval and Military Park, near the U.S.S. The Sullivans. Hopefully, some of the 560 Marines in attendance will recall the Park.

As a native Western New Yorker, it's been known that U.S.S. The Sullivans has needed repair for years. Even so, the breaking news of her taking on water so rapidly, and listing up to 45° was shocking and heartbreaking. By midday of 4/14/22 she had sunk to the level of her top deck but the appearance of the depth of submersion correlates directly with the level of the tide. She is fortunately supported by the shallow water depth. Without that shallow level, her injuries would have overcome her and the result would have been catastrophic. The holes in her hull have also allowed the leakage of thousands of gallons of oil and other contaminates into Lake Erie. Attempts to contain it are underway.

This story has made the national and international broadcasts. Local media has reported that the hull's failure is due to the harsh winters in Buffalo. My personal opinion is that efforts to prevent this tragedy could have been taken, and the upkeep was grossly insufficient.

At the time of this writing, thousands of gallons of water were repeatedly being pumped out of her belly. Divers and cameras have investigated the severity of the damage and have found at least a

dozen leaks to her hull. While some minor repairs have begun, many more are still needed. Surely if the water were not so shallow, the ship would have become a casualty. Multiple options are being discussed for repair, but each is remarkably expensive considering the urgency. Update, today (4/30/22), I can report that more repairs have been made, but still not enough to right her and give her back her dignity. Divers, doing repairs have been dedicated to saving her.

We, who live near Buffalo, have been fortunate to have her for so many years, but at 78, she has lived well beyond her expected lifetime. I find it sad that she requires such overwhelming repair. If a stitch in time saves nine, those nine stitches will cost us all dearly, not only financially, but historically. If she sinks, she will take a part of our collective hearts with her.

A Submarine, called The U.S.S. Croaker — and Battleship, The U.S.S. Little Rock also share the waters of the Park. I pray that they will be cared for well enough to avoid the same situation in the future for them.
